Seminar 1	General principles of BLS resuscitation in adults and children according to ERC 2021 standards. Automatic external defibrillator. Fixed lateral position. Choking. Discussion of basic resuscitation procedures, proper technique of performing them, use of AED and its role in resuscitation. Paying attention to the ability to recognize sudden cardiac arrest and return to a hemodynamically efficient rhythm. Presentation of the differences in resuscitation in children. Also, ways to respond to choking. Presentation of the fixed lateral position and its importance in securing an unconscious person.	E.W17., E.W18., E.W20., E.U8., E.U9.
Seminar 2	First aid in the dental office - specificity, requirements. Special situations: shock, anaphylaxis, etc. The seminar covers the most common health and life-threatening emergencies that occur in a dental office. Absences require credit by completing the outstanding material with the teaching assistant, preparing a presentation on a given topic and/or making up classes with another group. The final 10 minutes of the last class will be devoted to students completing the Class and Academic Teacher Assessment Survey.

If you fail to pass a course with the teaching assistant, you must take a make-up test on the date agreed with the course coordinator. In the event of failure to pass a make-up examination, a re-assessment examination with the participation of the Head of the Clinic is ordered.
