## 9. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Regulations for otorhinolaryngology classes:

Classes start at 7.30 in the seminar room of the Otorhinolaryngology Clinic of the Faculty of Dental Medicine of the Medical University of Warsaw (4th floor). Classes require a change of shoes and apron.

Arriving at class later than 15 minutes from their start is treated as being late. Three delays oblige to make up for one day (3 hours) during an emergency ENT duty.

Two absences are allowed, provided they are made up during an emergency ENT duty.

Three absences cause the block to fail.

Completion of classes takes place on the last day of the course with an assistant conducting classes.

Passing classes consists of attendance at practical courses and seminars and passing the final test.

In case of not passing the final colloquium, a revision test shall be held. If the student does not pass the revision test, a commission test shall be administered.

The test exam in the subject takes place after the end of the course. In case of not passing the revision exam (2nd term), a board examination is ordered.
