(sentence translation from English into Polish, mainly a dentist-patient dialogue)</p> <p>In terms of skills: Student observation during class - conducted by the teacher.</p> <p>In terms of competencies: Student observation and evaluation of competencies possessed during exercises.</p>	<p>Written test passing score – 60%</p> <p>Oral test passing score – 60%</p> <p>Form of receiving credit in the subject: credit with a grade</p> <p>To successfully complete the III year Polish language course and obtain credit, a student is required to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> attend all classes (min. 9 out of 10 in a semester) <p>A student who misses more than 1 class per semester without a valid excuse will not be allowed to take the course tests and will not receive course credits.</p> <p>Absences due to illness will be excused on presentation of a valid medical note within one week of return to study. In the case of two or more excused absences per semester the student must make up the missed classes. If a student misses a class, she/he must catch up on the missed material. The student is obliged to make up for each absence by performing a special written/oral task assigned by the teacher. It is the student's responsibility to communicate with the class teacher as soon as possible about any attendance issues.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> come to classes punctually <p>If a student arrives less than 15 minutes late three times per semester, it will count as one absence. Arriving to class more than 15 minutes late is counted as an absence.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> actively participate in each class complete all the assignments by the due date pass the progress test at the end of the winter semester and the course written and oral tests (covering the coursework of both the winter and summer semesters) at the end of the summer semester pass the Progress test. If the Progress test is failed, the retake will take place during the next scheduled classes. If it is failed the second time, the second retake will be during the following scheduled class. <p>A student who fails the course tests can take two retakes.</p> <p>The final course grade a student receives is the average (arithmetic mean) of the written and oral</p>

		<p>test grades (grades of 2-5), or a grade of 3 for passing a retake.
